Royal British Legion Grant	The Royal British Legion has launched a new grant scheme for veterans and their families who are struggling to pay their energy bills. The initiative will provide non-repayable emergency grants of up to £2,400 a year (£200 a month) and is available across the UK. In general, the Armed Forces community includes those who have served, or are serving, in the Royal Navy, British Army or Royal Air Force, as well as their families, dependants and carers — which can include children, current and former spouses and partners, widows and widowers. The Royal British Legion uses a broad definition of "Armed Forces community" — so even if you're not sure you fit in one of the categories above, it's worth checking your eligibility the website. If you're currently getting any means-tested state benefits, such as universal credit, pension credit or income support, you should qualify automatically. But you could still be eligible for a grant even if you don't get any benefits — the Royal British Legion will check your income and expenditure to assess your needs.
